Attendance: It is very important for your child to be at school every day. There is so much learning that goes on at this level that students cannot afford to be absent. Research indicates a direct relationship between a child's reading ability and his kindergarten and first grade attendance. There is so much done in the classroom in the teaching of reading that cannot be duplicated at home. Please, send your child to school unless he/she is ill.

Cold Weather: I will be sending the students out to recess as often as possible even during these cold months so please send your child(ren) to school dressed appropriately. Remember hats, gloves, scarves, and coats. I will follow the district's

weather guidelines provided to us by the National Weather Service to make decisions about windchill and outside recess. We typically send the students outside up to 25 degrees Fahrenheit. Once the windchill dips below that, we call for inside recess.

Christmas Gift Ideas: While making your Christmas lists, remember, books make great gifts for kids! There is nothing better than to give the gift of literacy to someone. Someone once said that the most comfortable place for a child is in the lap of someone reading to them.
